CAA Match Day Rules and Regulations 2025-26

Junior High Matches Singles and Doubles

Pro Set 6: 1st Player to win 6 games wins the set: No AD

Each game is 1st player to win 4 points: No AD

High School Singles Match

Best 2 of 3 sets match is over when a player wins 2 sets

1st and 2nd Set: 1st Player to win 6 games wins the set: No AD

Each game is 1st player to win 4 points : No AD

3rd set is a 10-point tie break 1st player to win 10 points: No AD

3rd Set 1st server dtermined by coin flip or other agreed upon method

High School Doubles Match

Pro Set 10: 1st doubles team to win 10 games wins the set: No AD

Each game is 1st player to win 4 points: No AD

For Doubles matches: When the game is 3-3 and the 7th point wins the game

Prior to playing for this point and ultimately closing out the game,

the receiving player or the receiving team in doubles chooses to recieve serve in the right court or the left court

NO-AD games mean the player only needs to win the game by one point (E.g. 4-3)

Sets can also be won by one game (e.g. 6-5 or 10-9)

Start the match by determining 1st server by coin flip or other agreed upon method

Players switch ends on odd number games: 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11

Players should abide by USTA rules for matches played with no referee or line judges

If there is any disgareement between players, the players should ask for assistance from both coaches involved

Each Player should each bring one can of balls for the match

Players must wear their school identified shirt when playing the match

Players should clean their court of trash when finished playing

Players should demonstrate sportsmanship per the CAA Constitution

Coaching and spectator Guidelines

Spectators are not allowed to coach any player who is playing a match

Spectators should demonstrate sportsmanship per the CAA Constitution

Spectators and Coaches are not allowed to assist in making line calls during play of any match

Coaches should demonstrate sportsmanship per the CAA Constitution

Coaches are only allowed to talk to their players during the switching of ends during a match, between games and sets

Coaches should help resolve any unresolved disagareements between players

Pre-Match procedure

The hosting school will maintain the official CAA match scoring form

Upon arrival at the match site, both schools coaching staffs should meet and exchange the following information

- ---- Who are the official coaches for each school on that match day (official coaches recognized by school administration)
 - ---- Exchange Roster sheets printed from the CAA Tennis Platform
- ---- Players who will be participating in the match and will be entered on the Official CAA Match Scoring form

Post Match procedure

The hosting school will record the results of the 6 individual matches on the Official CAA Match Scoring form

Both schools head coach will sign the Official CAA Match Scoring form verifying its accuracy

The hosting school will scan the Official CAA match Scoring form to Alan Weber

The hosting school will enter the Official CAA match Scoring form into the the CAA Tennis Platform by Tuesday following

The hosting school will enter the Official CAA Team match results into Game Source by Tuesday following

Trainers at Matches

The hosting school has liability when hosting

The CAA recommends that school provide a trainer or at least have a medical kit available and someone with medical knowledge

Tennis athletes can incur injuries the same as volleyball or basketball players

If schools want to hire an outside trainer, the CAA uses AT Direct Medical Services contact Casey 520-235-0067

Match Day Cancelations due to Rain or other circumstances

When a match is canceled due to unforeseen circumstances the following can occur:

- ---- Match cannot be rescheduled thus will not count in the Team and individual standings
- ---- If teams can agree and find court time to play then the match will count if completed before the end of the regular season
